TEACHING & LEARNING: Every student, Every classroom, Every day.

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD): Last week we completed our August student Census which is important for preliminary funding estimates for 2022. The census also includes data about students who speak a language other than English, Visa status and some information about students with additional needs (categorised as physical, social, cognitive or sensory needs.) We describe the level of teaching and learning adjustment that our students with additional needs require: Quality Differentiated Learning Programs (QDTP), supplementary strategies or substantial adjustments. Please be assured that these data do not include any student names and that the purpose of the NCCD data is to assist system level planning. Positive Behaviour Support (PBS)

Our Positive Behaviour Support team have been busily collating information gathered from classes to assist in the development of our behaviour matrix. The matrix will be in draft form very soon and we will be asking our staff and students for feedback. Once this has occurred we'll be asking parents for their feedback also.

What is our PBS Matrix? The PBS Matrix will explicitly outline our whole school Expectations and the behaviours that are linked to each expectation. A Positive Behaviour Support information session for parents and the wider community will be held next term.

POSITIVE PARTNERSHIPS


